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Executive summary

This is a summary report of a project implemented by Loyalist Township from April 10, 2014 to

December 31st, 2016. The project goals were to increase tonnage collected curbside on the mainland in

Loyalist Township and at the Amherst Island depot, reduce contamination at the curb by 10% over three years, increase the 2012 blue box diversion rate of 22% to 30% by the end of 2016, and meet Best

Practice requirements by having a communication plan in place for the program. The Continuous

Improvement Fund (CIF) provided financial and technical assistant in completing the project.

On April 10, 2014 Loyalist Township created and began implementation of a communication plan for the

Blue Box recycling program. During the first year of implementation, the municipality began

implementing the following promotional & educational (P&E) tactics:

Recycling information flyers

New metal signage at Depot (to be installed 2015)

• Implemented tracking of blue box rejection tags

Fridge magnets (to be distributed 2015)

In order to assess the impacts of P&E activities, Loyalist Township has completed the following

measuring & monitoring activities:

Compared yearly data regarding Blue Box materials collected at the curb

Compared yearly data regarding Blue box materials collected at the depot

The tonnage of materials collected from residents have slowly been increasing in recent years. Last

year, depot tonnage rose almost 10% relative to baseline and we have almost reached our objective of

diverting 52 MT of recyclables through this area of our programming. Overall, we have a ways to go to reach our goal of diverting 1,300 MT of recyclables through the Blue Box program, but staff are

confident in achieving this benchmark. Staff are keen to begin evaluation of participation both in the

curbside and depot programs and are planning to begin this monitoring program in 2015.

Due to staffing rearrangement this past year, the rollout schedule for P&E tactics in the communication

plan was delayed. Staff have reorganized the rollout schedule to account for the rearrangement and plan to complete the remaining tactics and monitoring from the plan by the end of the current planning

term (December, 2016).

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1 PROJECT INFORMATION

1.1 Municipal Information

Loyalist Township provides residents with multi-stream recycling through depot and curbside recyclable collections. The curbside collection alternates between blue (containers) and grey (fibres) boxes being collected at houses to limit costs. Loyalist Township mainland blue-box materials are collected at the curb and sent to the Kingston Area Recycling Centre for processing. Residents of Amherst Island deliver their blue box materials to a depot located at the Amherst Island Waste Disposal Site where it is collected and processed by Manco Recycling. The Amherst Island Waste Disposal Site is supervised during the hours of operation which are Wednesday, 11:00am – 2:00pm, Saturday, 10:00am – 12:00pm and Sunday, 2:00pm – 4:00pm.

Loyalist Township targets the following materials:

- Plastic food and beverage containers
- Aluminum and steel cans including paper cans with metal ends
- Glass food and beverage bottles and jars
- All fibres (OCC, boxboard, fine paper, newspaper, mixed paper) & Polystyrene

Collection of mainland recyclable materials is completed by Progressive Waste Solutions on a cost per tonne basis. Amherst Island recyclables are collected by Manco Recycling. There are no revenue sharing agreements in place between the municipality and the collections contractors. However, Loyalist Township does receive revenue from blue box materials that are processed at KARC.

1.2 Project Description

The Continuous Improvement Fund provided Loyalist Township with technical assistance and a grant of \$5,000 for the development of a communication plan for promotion and education of the Blue Box program and the implementation of P&E tactics. Tactics used by municipal staff include development of new signs at the Depot, magnets, incorporating recycling information in the yearly municipal calendar, and attempting to determine curbside setout and contamination rates.

Overall, this project was created to educate and promote Blue Box waste diversion in our municipality.

2 IMPLEMENTATION

2.1 Goals and Objectives

Increase Curbside Tonnage: Blue box tonnage collected at curbside in 2012 was 1130 MT. The goal for 2016 was to increase this by 15% to 1300 MT. Tonnage is calculated from weigh bills provided to staff from the processing contractor. This statistic is compiled annually by staff during the WDO datacall submission process.

Increase Depot Tonnage: Blue box tonnage collected at the depot in 2012 was 47 MT. The goal for 2016 was to increase this by 10% to 52 MT. Tonnage is calculated from weigh bills provided to staff from the processing contractor. This statistic is compiled annually by staff during the WDO datacall submission process.

Reduce Curbside Contamination: Blue box rejection tags will be used and tracked to establish a baseline in 2014. Once the baseline is established Loyalist Township will work to reduce contamination by 10% by the end of 2016.

Increase Blue Box Diversion Rate: The blue box diversion rate was 22% in 2012. The goal for 2016 was to increase this to 27%. Staff estimate the diversion rate by dividing the number of tonnes marketed through the Blue Box recycling program by the assumed generation rate of municipal solid waste from residences in the Loyalist Township service area. This statistic is calculated by staff annually during the WDO datacall submission process.

Increase Curbside participation: A baseline was to be established in 2014 to determine a setout rate. Once the baseline is established, Loyalist Township will work to increase that rate by 5% by the end of 2016.

Increase Depot Participation: A baseline was to be established in 2014 to determine recycling participation rates at the depot. Once the baseline is established, Loyalist Township will work to increase that rate by 5% by the end of 2016.

The promotion and education will have two main focuses on residents of the mainland, curbside recycling program as well as the residents of Amherst Island that recycle at the depot.

3 RESULTS

3.1 Results

Baselines for curbside contamination and participation rates have yet to be established, but Loyalist Township is working towards completing this data in 2015.

3.2 Analysis of project

Due to a municipal realignment, the lead staff member on this project could not afford the time or resources necessary to carry out the plan in its detail in the time frame projected. Some of the tactics have been implemented and others have not. A continued effort will be required in the future to meet the goals provided within this plan.

Tracking of recycling information tags began in 2014. The collection contractor struggled through corporate staffing and responsibility changes. The changes affected the frequency of data collection and therefore the data is inconsistent. Data collection has been more consistent in 2015, and a written procedure is being drafted that would benefit both parties.

A set-out rate survey was attempted in early 2015. It was noted very quickly that the paperwork for collection of the data needed to be revised to allow for better data capture. A follow up survey will be completed in late summer 2015.


It is important to note we have almost reached our 2016 goals for increased diversion, and increased depot tonnages as established in 2012. We believe that by yearend 2015 we will have reached, if not exceeded those goals.

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD Flatten, bundle & tie (with string) no larger than 3 feet x 2 feet x 8 inches. Limit of 6 bundles per pickup. Do not include boxboard or waxed

BOXBOARD (Cereal boxes, tissue boxes & milk & juice cartons). Flatten and place in a plastic bag, another box or tie in bundles with string. Rinse and flatten milk and juice cartons.

Remove liner bags from cereal boxes & place in garbage. Remove all plastic tabs & handles

NEWSPAPERS, HOUSEHOLD PAPERS,
MAGAZINES AND CATALOGUES
Tie in bundles with string or place in an untied plastic bag to prevent blowing litter.

PLASTIC BAGS

Place clean plastic bags in another plastic bag and tie shut. If a bag stretches when pulled, it is recyclable. If it doesn't stretch or tears, it is garbage.

Remove plastic overwrap from soft drink & bottled water cases.

Some items, including the list below, are not recyclable in our program. Please place in your garbage.

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



Sources of revenue for the Township's budget, together with the levies collected by the Township on behalf of the County and School Boards, are reflected in this chart.





2014 Tax Cost—What Taxpayers Receive

The 2014 tax cost per \$100,000 of residential property assessed value of \$733 (General Tax rate only) is reduced by \$109 of non departmental revenue for a net cost of \$624 or \$52 per month. For this annual cost of \$733, the taxpayer receives the following services:



Note: The Transit Area tax levy will add \$39.70 per \$100,000 of residential property assessed value for those living in the Transit Service Area.

Reminders to Residents

- Lawn Watering and Outdoor Water Use Restrictions are in effect from May 1st to September 30th. Residents whose civic addresses end with an odd number may water on odd numbered days and those whose civic number ends with an even number may water on even numbered days.
- The Hydrant Flushing program commenced on April 29th and continues until the fall. During this time, you may experience a slight discolouration in your water. If this occurs, run your tap from 5 to 10 minutes. If colour persists, please call the Engineering Clerk at 613-386-7351 ext. 116.
- Most of the recyclables that you place at the curb are purchased by companies that reuse those materials to make new products. Loyalist Township receives the proceeds from those sales and uses the funds to lower the cost of solid waste management. The more you recycle, the less you will pay. A "How-to-Recycle" information flyer will be mailed out soon - watch for it in the mail.
