

CIF Project #100 - Creating and Maintaining a Greener Black River-Matheson

Background

The project goal was to increase diversion rates by implementing measures which would enable residents to actively participate in the municipal recycling program. Increased diversion would only be obtained by encouraging recycling participation and increasing awareness of positive greener initiatives. The main objective of the project was to increase the number of recycling depots in Black River Matheson (BRM) from one to three and incorporate recycling into all municipal operations; such as facilities, parks and picnic areas. The proposal also involved the creation of a Green Team who would be responsible to research and provide advice on greener techniques as well as review and comment on a full Promotion and Educational program.

Summary of Results

Project was not complete due to change in personnel. The CIF rescinded the remaining funds for the project.

Financials

Total project cost was \$58,900. The CIF approved a total of \$41,900 of funding. Only \$31,029.60 was paid due to failure to deliver a final report.
